 - Instructional strategies, Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Data-informed decision making
 - Resources to improve student learning, requests to parent associations
 - Off-site activities, residencies

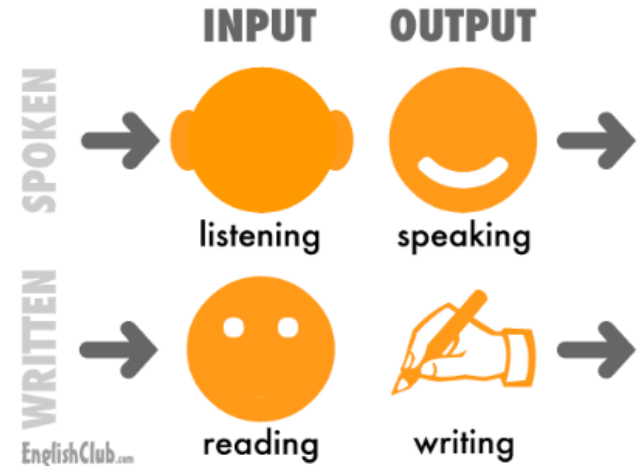

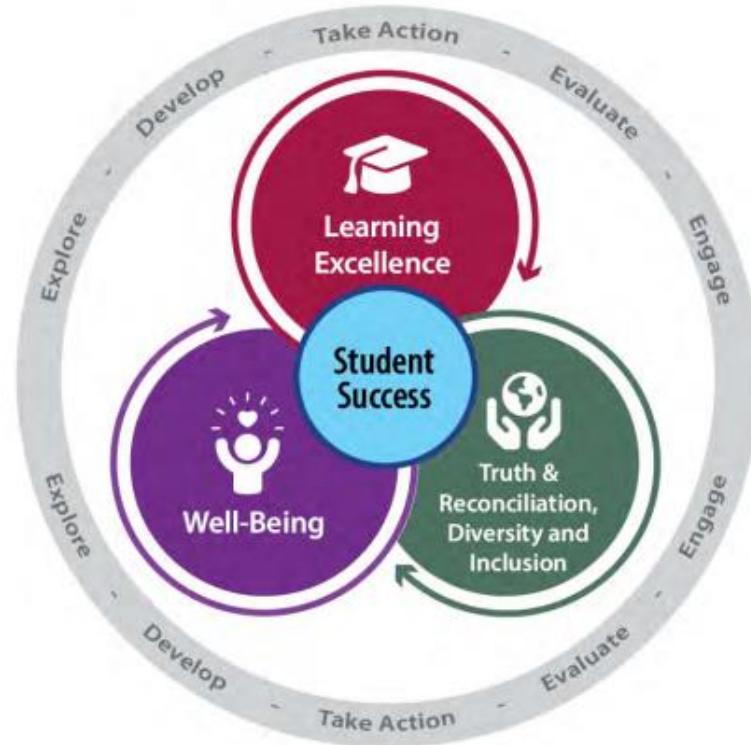


School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

Learning Excellence Actions

- *Clearly articulate learning intentions*
- *Build, share, and use exemplars with students to enrich student understanding of success criteria*
- *Use formative assessment to monitor progress towards learning goal*
- *NLA (Neuro-linguistic Approach) continued focus on the full NLA cycle (oral, reading, writing)*

Provide students with success criteria at each proficiency level

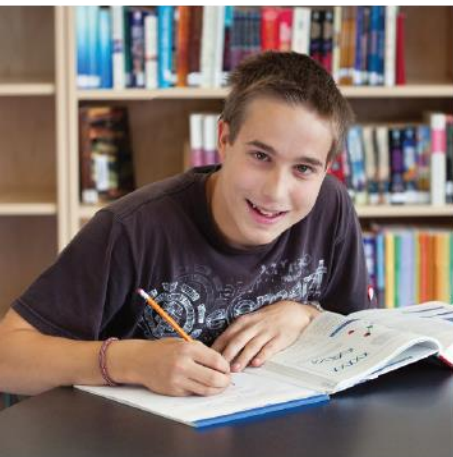
